ON-CALL/BULKY ITEM CLEAN-UP FOR TENANTS

The ACI of San Leandro clean-up program allows for more recycling, reuse, and less waste. Once a year, tenants can schedule an on-call/ bulky item clean-up to be placed curbside that consists of up to three cubic yards of reusable items, recyclable materials, yard trimmings, solid waste, & bulky items. Adopt a Storm Drain

San Leandro has over 2,200 storm drain inlets that can become clogged with



litter and leaf debris throughout the year.

This can lead to localized flooding and contamination of San Leandro Creek and the San Francisco Bay.

San Leandro residents and businesses can help the City and their neighborhoods by adopting one or more drains near their home or business. A new StopWaste Regulatory Fee will appear on your garbage bill starting July 1, 2026. This small fee funds state-required programs that support composting and recycling, food waste reduction, edible food recovery and donation, and plastic bag pollution prevention. Proper Sorting Starts With You

SAY "NO" TO CONTAMINANTS! Keep **GARBAGE** and **ORGANICS** out of the **RECYCLABLES** bin. Empty, rinse, or wipe recyclable plastic, metal, and glass food containers before placing them in the **RECYCLABLES** bin. KEEP AN EYE ON SIZE! Cardboard should be flattened and large pieces cut to 2' x 3' or smaller. This creates more room in the **RECYCLABLES** bin, prevents overflow and litter, and keeps materials from getting stuck in carts and blocking the hopper of the collection vehicles.

HOLIDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE

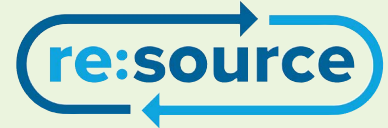
Collection days will **NOT CHANGE** during the week of Memorial Day or July 4.
