Composting and Recycling is the Law

Properly sorting your food scraps & other compostable materials not only helps fight climate change, it's the law.

State law (SB 1383) requires residents and businesses to keep compostable and recyclable materials out of California's landfills. The Alameda County Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance (ORRO) requires that all plant debris be separated from the garbage and recycling.

THE HANDY KITCHEN

PAIL makes collecting food scraps and food-soiled paper easy. Tenants empty the pail into the green organics bin when full. **Please note - you must have organics collection service to receive pails.**



SPECIAL RECYCLING TOTE BAGS

can be used by tenants to transport recyclables from their home to the blue recyclables bin at the complex.

One bag and pail per unit provided at no charge.

TRASH-FREE TIP

It's Easy to Be Trash-Free When Moving

Whether residents are packing it up or just settling in, make sure the moves at your complex are as environmentally friendly as possible. Share these trash-free moving tips with your tenants.



- Use what you already have for packing material. Use your clothing, sheets, and towels to protect fragile or delicate items.
- Go online. Check Craigslist, Freecycle, Facebook Marketplace, and other platforms to find or offer moving supplies.
- Pass it on. Moving companies like U-Haul may offer or accept gently-used boxes for reuse at no charge.
- Find a green moving company. Search for eco-minded movers who use reusable and recyclable moving supplies.
- Rent reusable. Find a reusable packaging rental company, such as Zippgo or Rentacrate, to avoid excess moving waste.

The Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (WELO)

WELO establishes minimum water efficiency standards that apply across California to qualifying residential, commercial, institutional, and public projects.



The ordinance promotes healthy landscapes that reduce water waste through appropriate plant selection, efficient irrigation, and the use of compost and mulch to improve soil health and water retention. No Bags!



No bags are needed in the recycling collection program. Keep recyclables loose, Recyclables in bags, especially opaque/black ones, are sorted out as garbage and end up in the landfill.
